







SMR-1

The SMR-1 is a holdover reticle for longrange field and PRS-style shooters. The illuminated centre makes it also ideal for low-light hunting. It features an open top, a floating centre dot, 0.2 mil hash marks and an integrated free floating ruler with 0.1 mil hash marks for easier target measurement.



The holdover "Christmas tree" has 0.2 hash marks for distance and windage hold, the numbers for mil holdover are placed 1.2 mil on the right from centre to be easily spotted when counting holdover, but still far enough not to cover the target at the most critical parts of the reticle.



SMR-2

SMR-2 is more of a crossover reticle between hunting and shooting and it has all the same features as the SMR-1, aside from the "Christmas tree" in the SMR-1. Making it more suitable for the shooter that rarely utilizes the tree for holding over.
